

## How to Make a Bears Paw Like Mine

(so we can build a Quilt for Survivors together)

My Bears Paw finishes at 14 ½ inches because I am adding a 2 1/2 inch (2 in finished) sash.

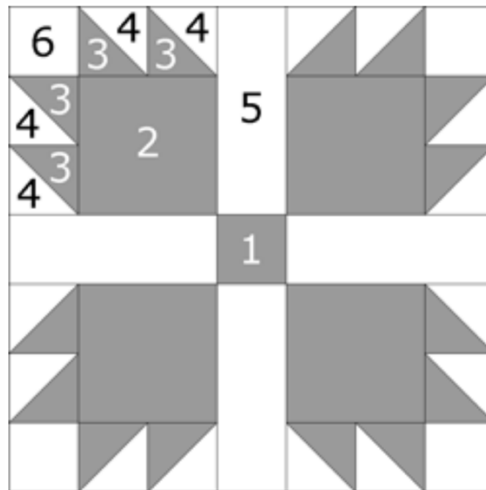
You need two fabrics (White and Blue) and an orange center (that I can provide)

			7"	10½"	14"
Patch	Fabric	Qty			
1	A	1	1½" x 1½"	2" x 2"	2½" x 2½"
2	A	4	2½" x 2½"	3½" x 3½"	4½" x 4½"
3**	A	2	4¼" x 4¼"	5¼" x 5¼"	6¼" x 6¼"
4**	Backgrnd	2	4¼" x 4¼"	5¼" x 5¼"	6¼" x 6¼"
5	Backgrnd	4	1½" x 3½"	2" x 5"	2½" x 6½"
6	Backgrnd	4	1½" x 1½"	2" x 2"	2½" x 2½"
Unfinished Block Size			7½"	11"	14½"
Grid Size			1"	1½"	2"

\*\* These pieces are over size so you can make half square triangles using the *8-at-a-time* method.

Draw an X corner to corner and sew  $\frac{1}{4}$  on both sides of the line

Cut apart center to center and on the drawn line

Press to the dark
