Block Lotto: Scrappy Flying Geese Pairs - April 30, 2024



COLOURWAY: Bright, modern, scrappy. Try to keep to the most modern fabrics you've got and go for good contrast between the "goose" and the "sky" components. The block is composed of FOUR pairs of flying geese, with each pair using the same fabrics for the geese and sky. Use the sample as a guide of sorts.

TUTORIAL: There are many tutorials out there for making flying geese. Choose one that makes a 3" x 6" finished flying goose. Here are 3 options:

- 1. This tutorial shares TWO methods for making flying geese that are the correct size for our block: Easy Flying Geese Quilt Block Tutorial - Suzy Quilts
- a. flying geese block that uses only squares and rectangles:
- b. no-waste flying geese (makes 4 FGs at a time so this is the perfect opportunity to make 2 block lotto blocks!!
- 2. This tutorial has a different method for making four at a time (scroll down) <u>Flying Geese Tutorial</u> <u>Thimblesandneedles</u>

3. I used the Fons and Porter Flying Geese Ruler to make my geese. Please be comfortable using the method of your choice.

Create 4 pairs of Flying Geese per block and arrange the "geese" triangles both pointing in the same direction (ie don't flip so that you make a square in a square). You can then arrange the pairs all pointing in the same direction like the sample, or you can mix it up (see the layouts below).







FINAL SIZE: Please keep an eye on your seam allowances. The block size is $12\frac{1}{2}$ "x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished/12"x12" finished. (Each pair should be $6\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished)
