

Mystery Quilt

Part Four: Assembling the Quilt

Assembling 25 Units of 4 Blocks each:

Using the half square triangle squares made in the previous part -and- the solid color squares cut in the part before you will assemble the following 6 different Units of 4. Sew the number shown for each. Fabric A is shown here as Blue, Fabric B is shown as a black tweed and Fabric C is shown as white.

For easiest assembly - first sew the two top pairs of squares for each unit, then the two bottom pairs. Then, matching center seam, sew the two pairs into the Unit of 4.

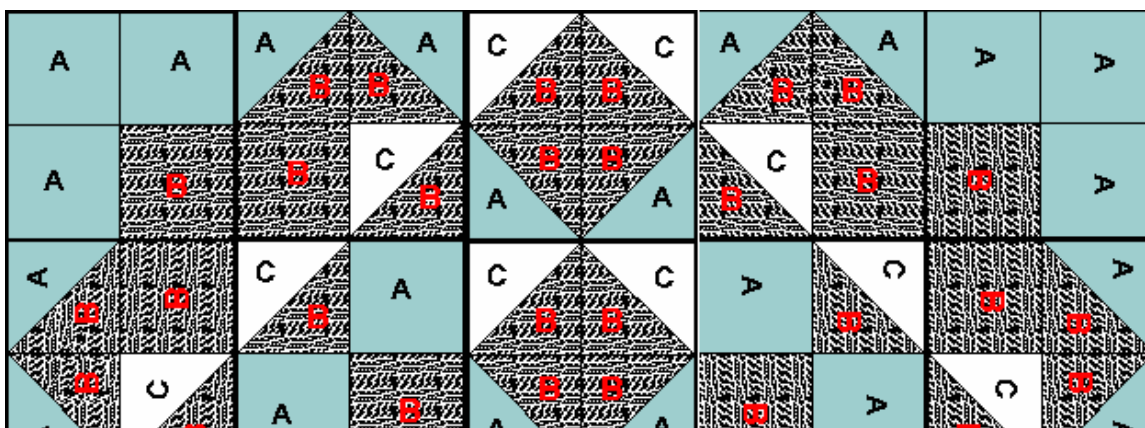
If you used different fabrics for A, B and/or C - assemble them randomly in these units.

Assembling the Mystery Quilt Top!

1. Using the assembled units from Part 3B and a one unused square you still haven't sewed. Use that one square as below in the middle.



2. Now assemble two of the 16-unit squares with one of the 2-units in the middle as below.

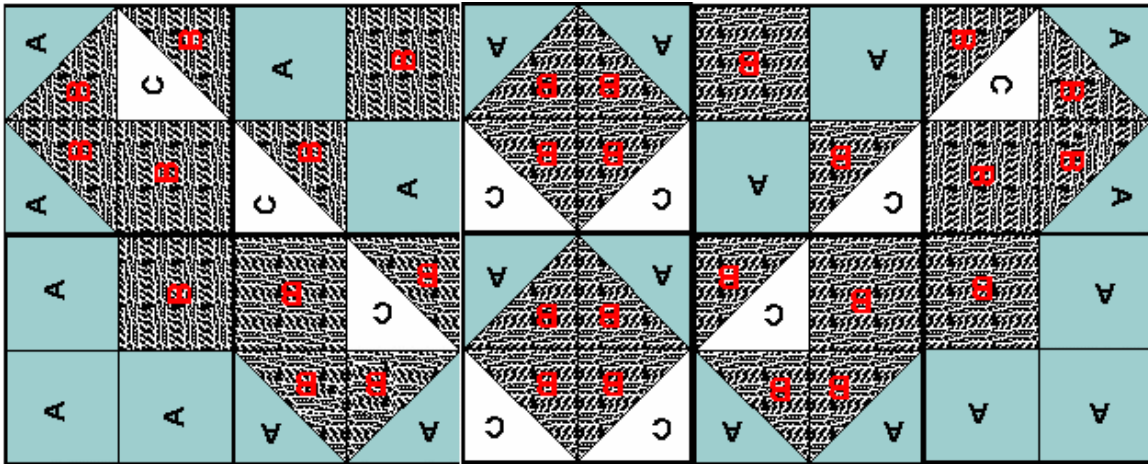


3. Make one

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more as you did in #2 just above.

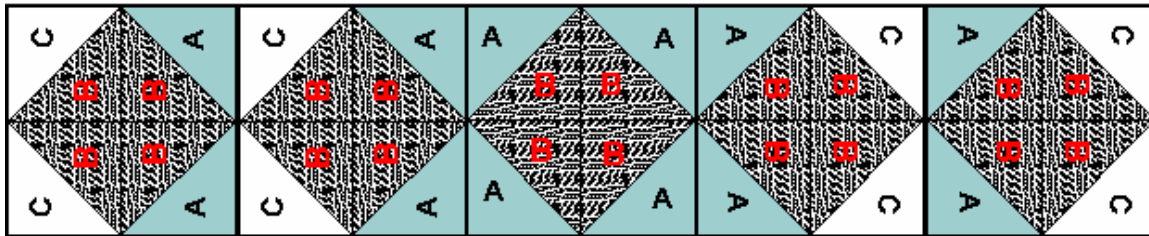
It'll be used upside down as below.

The strip you make in #1 above will be placed between the two parts from #2 and #3.

Use scraps make a border if you wish. I just used a backing and used mine as a table topper since I used a Christmas theme



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
